
## **Taking Back Spiritual Joy**

Do you feel too attached to your phone, to work, to social media and to things that feel like they waste your time? Are you struggling to overcome certain sins? Do you feel distant from God, or that you need to be spiritually rejuvenated? You may be suffering from Acedia. Acedia is what the early church fathers described as the sin that steals Christian joy, leads to spiritual apathy, disillusionment, and ultimately causes us to abandon our pursuit of holiness and love of God. It infiltrates our lives slowly by leading us to abandon the small and simple daily practices that feed our spiritual life, ultimately starving our souls. Here are a few antidotes given to us by the church fathers to fight against the spiritual malady of Acedia.

**Tears of repentance:** A deep look at our sins and failings, along with a good confession, help us recognize that we are not perfect, and still need God and his forgiveness. Not to mention, confession cleanses our souls and restores us to the right relationship with God.

**Tears of Suffering:** Whatever your sufferings are, bring them before God intentionally, allowing the good and merciful Lord to suffer with you and carry you in this burden, reminding you, you are



not alone. This involves physically or mentally either saying these things to him or writing them down in his presence.

**Work of prayer:** Intentional time set aside with God is absolutely essential to fighting acedia. Our souls cannot abide with Christ, unless **our bodies** spend time abiding with him as well.

**Work of Charity:** Outside of your duties, do something for someone else. Again, intentionality is key. Even if this takes place at work, make the intentional effort to help someone in need at home, at work, or in the streets.

**Feed your spiritual mind:** Most of us believe false things about God, i.e. he is quick to judge, angry, disappointed in us, out to get us. We need to consume (read, listen to) true things about his character. He is good, merciful, loving, desirous of our growth, and patient. Most importantly he is on our team. He wants you to be holy, good, sanctified, joyful, and he wants to help you get there. Find podcasts, books, or youtube videos that make a slight change/benefit to how you think about God. Ex: The fulfillment of all desire by Ralph Martin, Story of a Soul by St. Therese of Lisieux, The Noonday Devil by Dom Jean-Charles Nault.




## NATURE NOTES

Observant students have found praying mantids on campus at least twice now!

These delightfully strange, almost cartoonish insects seem to mimic our saint statues and pictures, with their arms lifted in prayer. While the name "mantis" comes from the Greek word meaning "prophet" or "seer", the name and posture of these insects is likely where their similarity to saints ends.

Mantids are extraordinarily skilled predators. They are the only insects that can turn their heads to look over their "shoulders." They blend in with their surroundings, staying perfectly still until they notice the movement of prey nearby. Then they leap into action, literally faster than the human eye can process, using their specialized bodies to ensnare and hold their hapless prey. Mantids will eat just about any other creature, from small insects to other mantids, to lizards and small birds like hummingbirds. They are a dubious friend to gardeners, as they will eat pollinators and beneficial insects as easily as pest insects.

However, some of their unique characteristics make them a fascinating subject for scientists. Mantids are the only (known) non-vertebrate to have 3D vision. Mantids process 3D images by comparing changes in motion as perceived by each eye. Research on mantid eyesight could lead to development of robots that are able to process 3D images with much simpler computers than current technology (based on human vision).

Many of the saints refer to creation as a book God has written for us.

These little mantids are a delightful reminder that no matter how many times we "read" creation, there's always something new and wonderful for us to discover. For more information on mantids:







