

Who was St. Albert the Great?



Albert was a German Dominican priest, and teacher of St. Thomas Aquinas. His own achievements in shaping Christian and scientific thought are unexcelled. He was responsible for bringing the science of Greeks and Arabs into European universities. He encouraged the idea of an experimental approach to science, and contributed a wealth of observational information to the fields of botany and zoology.

He is a doctor of the church and patron saint of scientists and philosophers. His feast day is November 15.
