4-H Program to Make History

Nolan Catholic students are making history under the first charter for the Diocese of Fort Worth. The students have decided to jump into their first jackpot show this coming Sunday, December 6th at the KCJLS Holiday Classic in Kaufman County at Kaufman County Fairgrounds.

The Nolan Catholic 4-H Goat Show team has trained their animals, learned to brace, trimmed hooves, drench with dewormer, has placed each goat on an exercise regimen, tracked and adjusted a rich diet with probiotics and nutrients, and has engineered their own barn structure. They have also kept up with the daily maintenance of stalls and care for the barn area. The growth of these students over the past few months has been inspirational to watch.





As our student show team continues to train, they have opted to jump into competition-mode for some experience before they enter full show-mode in February. As the Kaufman Holiday Classic is a practice show, the students will clean, lightly groom animals, and go through the process of preparing, loading, registering, weighing, and working through the show process. Nolan Catholicwill have four show team exhibitors for Sunday and three NCHS show team members joining us to observe. There are 14 other students wanting to show goats and lambs. Stay tuned for our Chicken Show Team in the Spring.
