Balancing Tradition and Innovation: Embracing Technology in a Catholic High School

Nolan Catholic High School is excited to announce that we are already looking towards the 2025-2026 school year and what that means for technology on campus. This includes the possibility of the implementation of a one-to-one (1:1) technology model. As of today, the school possesses enough computers to make this a reality, ensuring that each student has access to a school laptop at all times, and as a result, providing a seamless integration of technology in the classroom.

a community is: Is an official 1:1 computer model the path for Nolan Catholic? Universal access to laptops is one thing, assigning a computer to each student is a much more ambitious model.

A transition as monumental as this one will require student and parent input. We believe that the perspectives of our community are crucial in shaping a model that best serves our students' needs and prepares them for future success. Although we will be seeking input via surveys and discussions throughout the upcoming school year, please do not hesitate to contact Mr. Ortiz directly, who is eager to explore the option of a 1:1 computer model as well as a much broader conversation regarding AI.

An important detail to note: as part of this process, the school is preparing to remove from its Student and Parent Handbook the current BYOD (Bring Your Own Device) policy. This means that for the 2025-26 school year, students will no longer need to bring their personal devices to school, as each student will either have access to, or be provided with a school-issued device. This change aims to create a more uniform learning environment for all.

Stay tuned for more details and opportunities to share your input as we plan for the 2025-2026 school year. We look forward to working together as a community to ensure the success of this initiative.

Important Technology Policy Update


Parking Passes, Locker Assignments, and Esto Dux Social | August 7 and 8, 2024

TCU defensive lineman NaNa Osafo-Mensah has been nominated for the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team, one of the most coveted community service awards in college football.

Osafo-Mensah has volunteered at Cook Children's Medical Center in Fort Worth, as well as with the City's Community Crossroads program through First Presbyterian Church's mission outreach center. He served meals to and sat with the homeless at Broadway Baptist Church. He also is a role model with youth through the NCAA's Readers Become Leaders program within Fort Worth ISD.

Zach Cawyer '21 Drafted to the Kansas City Royals Zachary Cawyer was the first Horned Frog drafted on Day 3 of the MLB Draft, going to Kansas City with the second pick of the 11th round (317th overall).

Cawyer put together a strong junior campaign in his lone season on campus. He ranked second on the team with 24 appearances, 23 of which came out of the bullpen. He posted a 6-2 record with a 5.20 ERA. In 36 1/3 innings of work, he fanned 39. At the conclusion of the season, he was named honorable mention All-Big 12.
